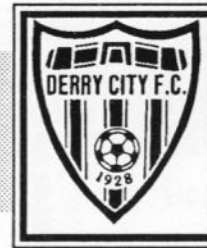

Around Europe



While City attempt to regain some pride by reducing the three goal deficit against Vitesse Arnhem tonight other Irish clubs will be doing the same in the various European competitions. As usual the involvement of Irish clubs in Europe this year has not exactly been a tale of success and has raised the probability that from next season on they will be expected to play in a preliminary round against teams of equivalent ability before being given the opportunity to meet any of the "glamour boys" in the first round proper.

The League of Ireland's three representatives this year in Europe were Shelbourne, Bohemians and Derry. Shels, despite putting up a great performance in both legs against Tavia Somperol, have already been eliminated from the Champions Cup. Bohemians did exceptionally well in their first leg at Dalymount Park against Steau Bucharest and their fate will already be known by now as their game finished at 6.15 p.m. this evening. Lets hope that they may have broken the first round barrier of the Cup Winners Cup. City face a three goal deficit from the first leg of the U.E.F.A. Cup and with all the good will in the world it is highly unlikely that they will be able to overcome Vitesse by 4 goals tonight.

The Irish League representatives, Glentoran, Glenavon and Portadown have fared no better than their southern counterparts. Glentoran met the mighty Marseille at the Oval and were hit for five and face further pasting in the return leg. The only consolation (and a major one at that) was the massive amount of money they received for the T.V. rights which would be a welcome boost for any Irish club. Portadown, who met Standard Liege were also on the wrong end of a drubbing and have no hope of progressing. Like Bohs, Glenavon earned a respectable 1-1 draw with Royal Antwerp and entertain some hope of causing an upset in the return leg.

Not exactly a tale of glory, but lets hope that in the return legs all the Irish clubs can regain some pride.

City hold U.C.D. to a scoreless result at Belfield Park, Dublin. The Brandywell club's first drawn result.

Sunday, 28th September, 1986:

DERRY CITY 3 - ATHLONE TOWN 3

Derry drew 3-3 in a thrilling League Cup game at Brandywell against the Midlanders.

Sunday, 27th September, 1987:

DERRY CITY 7 - CORK CITY 2

Derry trounce Cork City following a magnificent first half display which saw them lead 6-0 at half-time. Jonathan Speak netted his first hat-trick for the club as Derry went on to win 7-2.

Sunday, 25th September, 1988:

DERRY CITY 1 - ST. PATRICK'S ATHLETIC 0

City beat St. Patrick's Athletic narrowly at Brandywell thanks to a goal from defender, Jack Keay.

Wednesday, 27th September, 1989:

BENFICA 4 - DERRY CITY 0.

City lose 0-4 in the magnificent Stadium of Light in Lisbon to go out of the European Cup at the hands of the mighty Benfica. Scorers for the Portuguese side were - Mats Magnusson, Garcia Vata, Riamundo Ricardo and Santos Aldair.

Saturday, 29th September, 1990:

GALWAY UNITED 3 - DERRY CITY 1

Derry lose 3-1 in Terryland Park in what was Jim McLaughlin's 100th game in charge. Kevin Brady made his 100th appearance and City's Tony McCarthy scored his first goal for the club. Gerry Mullen's goal for Galway was the 300th conceded by the Brandywell club.

Sunday, 29th September, 1991:

ST. PATRICK'S ATHLETIC 0 - DERRY CITY 1

City recorded their 75th victory in the Premier Division by defeating St. Patrick's Athletic 0-1 at Harold's Cross. Donal O'Brien scored the winning goal.



DERRY CITY RECORD IN EUROPE

Since re-entering senior football seven years ago, Derry City have played a total of seven games to date and during those games the club has used a total of thirty different players.

Midfielder Paul Carlyle and defender, Paul Curran, are the only players who have taken part in all seven games while Carlyle is the only Derry player to have scored a goal in Europe when he netted against Benfica at the Brandywell in the European Cup. City, of course, lost the first leg tie 1-2 before being beaten 4-0 in the Stadium of Light in Lisbon.

Derry have yet to win a game in Europe, however the club has recorded two draws and five defeats. They have conceded 14 goals.

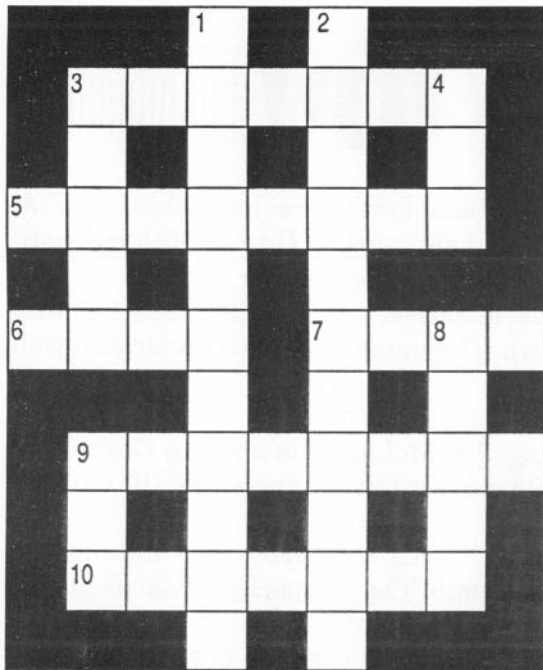

RAIMOND VAN DER GOUW (Goalkeeper)

At the age of seven he was already goalkeeper of FC Berghuizen where he played during his youth. In 1983 he signed a contract with Go Ahead Eagles in Deventer where he was trained by Jan Jongbloed. In 1988 he signed his first contract. Raimond played for several representative teams. In his spare time he likes dogs, photography and driving, which he combined with his secondary profession of teaching P.E.

THEO BOS (Defender). From 1971 to 1977 Theo played as a forward with Sempre Avanti Young Eleven in Arnhem. After that period he went to Vitesse Arnhem where he became a defender and has been a regular first team choice since 1984. In his spare time he enjoys eating, bowling and going to the movies and last summer became the proud father of son Luuk.

EDWARD STURING (Defender). Edward played for eight years with the Apeldoornse Boys and one year with AGOVV. From 1980 to 1986 he was right back with De Graafschap in Doetinchem. Since 1987 Edward has played on the right side of defence with Vitesse and is also the team captain. His ambition is to gain more international caps and reach as high a level as possible with Vitesse Arnhem.

ROBERTO STRAAL (Defender). Roberto was born in Arnhem and began his career with Zuid-Arnheim before moving on to De Graafschap in 1983 where he remained until 1986 and later signed for Vitesse in 1987. Roberto also has an administrative job apart from his football interests and is "crazy" about playing tennis.

ARJAN VERMEULEN (Forward). Arjan began playing football at the age of six with a youth team called Fortitudo and ten years later he found himself playing for the youth team of PSV Eindhoven. In 1988 he joined Vitesse Arnhem where he plays on the left wing. His hobbies include tennis and fishing.

MARTIN LAAMERS (Midfield). Martin played for Arnhemse Boys during his youth and his

professional career started in Wageningen. In 1987 he was offered a contract at Vitesse and over the last five seasons he has become a valuable player in midfield. In the 89/90 season Martin made his debut in the Dutch National side. It has been said that a number of people enjoy his talents as a singer!

JOHN VAN DEN BROM (Midfield). John played for the amateur club Amersfoort from 1971 to 1987 whereupon he signed for Vitesse and has extended his playing contract until the age of 40 with the club and he has also been selected twice for the Dutch National team. His interests include tennis, reading and listening to music.

RENÉ EIJER (Midfield). René played from 1980 to 1986 in the defence and midfield for Sparta Rotterdam and was transferred in 1987 to VVV in Venlo in the south of the Netherlands and still lives in this quiet, country area. In 1989 René signed for Vitesse where he plays in the left side of midfield. His hobbies include tennis, socialising and watching films.

BART LATUHERU (Winger). Bart comes from the west part of the Netherlands and began his football in Capelle with Zwervers. During the 70's and 80's he played mainly in Rotterdam with Sparta, Xerxes and Excelsior. In 1989/90 he joined Vitesse and has played on the right wing since. He has played in several national teams and one of his hobbies is playing snooker.

HANS VAN ARUM (Forward). Hans began his career in 1974 with SDVBM Barneveld and transferred to Vitesse in 1989 where he plays centre forward. His hobbies include computers, fishing and tennis.

PHILIP COCU (Midfield/Wing). Philip played in the young eleven of DCS in neighbouring city to Arnhem, Zevenaar and later in 1986 played for one season with De Graafschap and moved on to AFC '34. In 1987 he joined AZ '67 and in 1990 was transferred to Vitesse Arnhem. Philip can play either in midfield or on the left wing. During last season he was selected several times for the Olympic team.



When Derry City travelled to Holland for the first leg of this U.E.F.A. Cup tie, the game against Vitesse Arnhem marked City's 300th competitive game since returning to senior soccer in September, 1985.

Derry's first competitive game, of course, was that historic 3-1 victory over Home Farm in the League Cup. The game took place at Brandywell on Sunday, September 8th, 1985.

Since that day the club has been managed by a total of four individuals - Jim Crossan, Noel King, Jim McLaughlin and Roy Coyle. And in the 300 games played a total of 98 players have represented the club. Of those 98, 51 have scored goals.

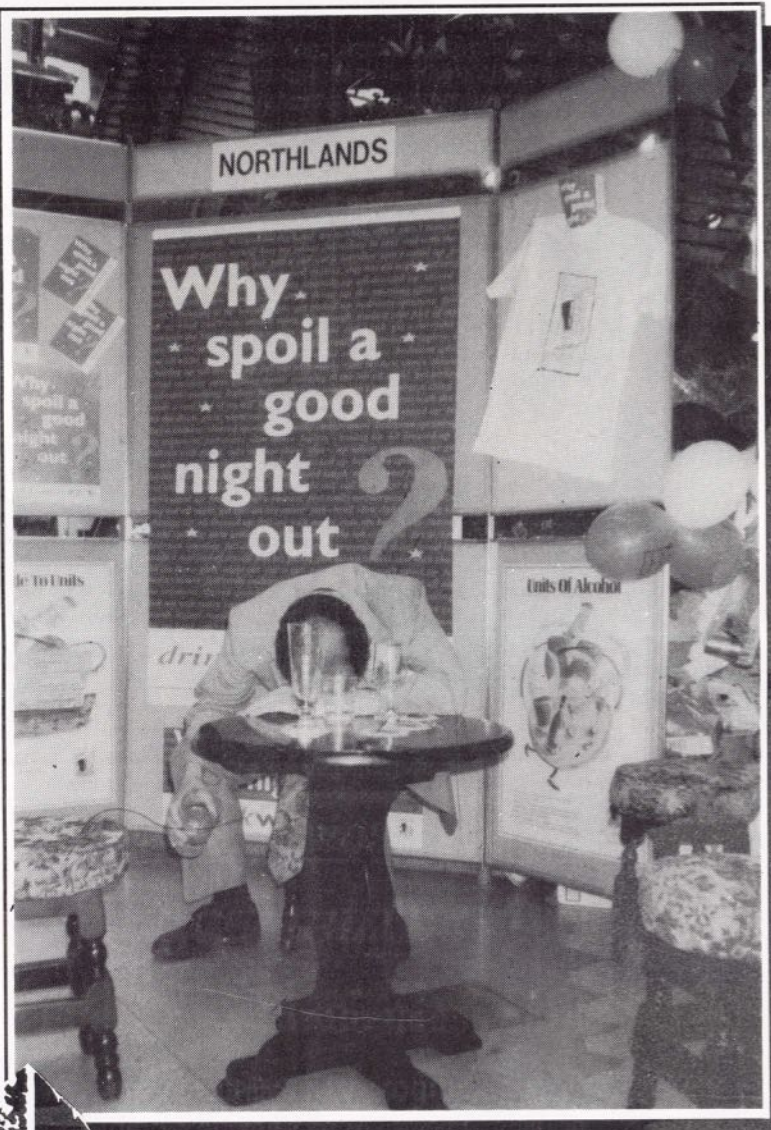
Central defender, Paul Curran, holds the record for making the largest number of appearance for the club. The former Finn Harps player has worn Derry City colours on a total of 220 occasions.

The most frequent visitors to Brandywell over the past seven years have been Shelbourne and Sligo Rovers both of whom have met Derry on 22 occasions at the Brandywell.

Of the 300 games played, City have recorded 169 wins, drawn 68 and lost 63 games. In the process the club has scored 572 goals and conceded 248.

ABE KNOOP (*Goalkeeper*). Abe was born in Curacao where he completed his education in economics, administration and computing. Since the age of 18 Abe has concentrated on being a goalkeeper only and was the substitute keeper of Ajax Amsterdam during the 1990/91 season. The following year he signed for Vitesse Arnhem.

ERWIN VAN DER LOOI (*Defender*). In his youth Erwin played for clubs in the surroundings of Arnhem, namely RKHVV and Vitesse 1892. Although under contract with Vitesse Arnhem he played for most of last season with BVV Den Bosch. Erwin specialises in eliminating centre forwards!

HUUB LOEFFEN (*Forward*). Huub is a student of Economics and Administration and signed a contract with Vitesse in 1988 his previous clubs being AAC and Leones and scored the only goal of the game in his last encounter two seasons ago against Derry City in one of his famous "rushes". Huub's interests include table tennis, tennis and surfing.

DENNIS KRIJGSMAN. Dennis is still following administrative and economic studies and up until last year he was playing for ARC in the city where he was born, Alphen aan de Rijn. Since October 1990 he has played several matches with the Dutch Amateut team and as a result of his performances there he was

offered a contract last season with Vitesse Arnhem.

HERBERT NEUMANN (*Manager*). Impressive teams and experiences in several foreign countries mark the career of Herbert Neumann. As player and coach Herbert, who has German nationality, played for the following clubs: FC Koln, Udinese, Bologna and Olympia Pireaus and he became famous for his excellent shooting technique. As player/coach he ended his active career in Chiasso, Switzerland and played once for the German National Team.

JAN JONGBLOED (*Assistant Manager*). At the age of 12 Jan started to play football as a forward with VVA. Later at 18 he became a goalkeeper with DWS, both clubs coming from Amsterdam, and he played with DWS for 18 years was then transferred to Roda JC where he spent a further four seasons. Jan finished his goalkeeping career at Go Ahead Eagles in Deventer. Shortly afterwards he moved to Vitesse Arnhem and became assistant to Herbert Neumann. Jan played in the Dutch Eleven during the years of Johan Cruyff and was the 'keeper of that side in the final of the World Championships in 1974. His own special style of goalkeeping became legendary as he was renowned for standing far out in front of his goal and sometimes participated in the game as a normal player.
